- 3. 38 quilts made by OWQ members, many using Teri Scott's donated fabric, were taken by Dee G to Broadway Quilts in Sonoma as part of the effort to give a quilt to every Kindergarten through 2nd grade child in Middletown to help ease the trauma of the fire. Thank you to all who participated.

Sharon and I hung Christmas quilts at the library on the 4th and I would like to thank those who shared their quilts. The librarians were delighted to have them decorate the library for the holidays.

Service Committee members report - Sandi S, chairperson

Judy Whitlock: I am checking with OB weekly and took 4 quilts in yesterday. They now have 10 and I have plenty more at my house for a while.

Marcia Weeks: I took Texture quilts (about 15-did not count, but close enough) to Sherwood Oaks.

Sharon Lau: I dropped off 15 dog beds at the *Humane Society* in mid-November.

Dee Goodrich delivered 38 quilts to the Sonoma Quilt shop which is collecting quilts for the children in Middletown affected by the fires there.

Grace Van Doren: I continue to turn in 3 dog beds every month to the Second Chance dog charity as usual. I have made and donated 54 pillowcases to the following organizations: 30 flannel pillow cases to Safe Passage for their "Celebration of Bed Time Stories" on Oct 7^{th,} 2015 and 24 cotton pillow cases to Redwood Community Services for foster children (12 for their summer camp and 12 in December) Connie Mitchell: Her daughter delivered 18 "goodie bags" to the lady who fills them for the Shriner Hospital children.

So, we have enough baby quilts and texture quilts for a while, but don't let that stop you from making them or any other of our projects.



The White Ribbon Alliance for Safe Motherhood

Every minute of every day, a woman dies of pregnancy related complications. Stories of Mothers Lost, an exhibit of handmade quilts from around the world now on display in Lane Hall, memorializes some of these women.





membership based organization, whose goal is to reduce rates of maternal and child mortality. The initiative to obtain these stories was made possible by a United Nations Population Fund grant to the WRA. Following a global call, there was an overwhelming response of 120 panels from 46 organizations. Stories of Mothers Lost - a collection of internationally sourced, hand crafted panels commemorating mothers lost - allows families to express grief and also plays a powerful role as a mechanism for advocacy and communication on an issue that transcends country borders and impacts us all.

Stories of Mothers Lost is supplied by the UM Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology and its Program in Sexual Rights and Reproductive Justice. The exhibit is hosted by the Women's Studies Department and the Institute for Research on Women and Gender.
