

Double Friendship Star

As shown by Becky at the 2/14/2016 OWQ meeting –
from a Missouri Star Quilt Company tutorial

Start with 3 high-contrast fabrics – they should be solid or read as solid (i.e. tone on tone)

You need 1 yard of Fabric A, 1 yard of Fabric B, and $\frac{1}{2}$ yard of Fabric C which will be the color in between the stars.

If you make 5 blocks across and 6 blocks down, you will get a quilt top that is approximately 38" x 48". Becky did 4 across by 5 down, then added a border.

Cut 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips - width of fabric – from each of your fabrics.



Sew together the strips of Fabric A and Fabric B using a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam. Press the seam toward the darker fabric.

Cut the strip into 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " pieces.


Cut the Fabric C strip into 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

Place one Fabric C square on each corner of your Fabric A+B square. Stitch across the diagonal. Trim to $\frac{1}{4}$ ". Press.



Your block will now look like the one to the left.

When you have 4 of these blocks, you will sew them together, matching your Fabric A's like the one to the right.



Sew the blocks together into rows.

When you sew the rows together, the pattern will magically show a second set of friendship stars!
