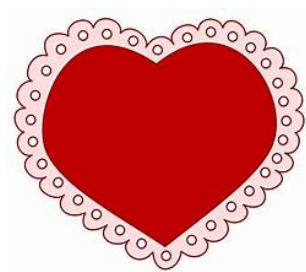

Your Vote Will Make a Difference

The Fort Bragg Quilt Show Committee would like to purchase additional metal quilt frames for the 2024 show. Since this is a non-budgeted item that costs more than \$50, per the OWQ By-Laws a vote by the membership will be necessary. This expenditure will be discussed at the General Meeting on February 12th. If a motion is made, the vote will take place at the General Meeting on March 10th.

The additional frames will permanently replace a row of hard to assemble and dangerous wooden frames. The additional frames will give the quilt show more flexibility in displaying quilts.

The total cost is \$1,253.93 and will use money from the FBQS funds.

Reminder about lending your quilts for the Quilt Walk, it's that time of year again. We currently have 15 quilts turned in! Below you will find all the information, thank you.

Business Quilts: The preferred quilt sizes for businesses are 18x24 or 12x12. We will need about 96 quilts. Ideas for quilts are:

- Previous Quilt Show Challenge quilts
- Brown Bag Challenge quilts
- Quilts in progress-make an extra block for the Quilt Walk-turn it into a wall hanging
- Make any single block of your favorite pattern.
- Make a quilt that reflects a business, or reflects the show theme of "*Around the Block*"

Library Quilts: The Library can display 5 larger quilts (approx. 60"x60") and numerous misc. sized quilts. They'll find a place to display as many quilts as we can provide them!

Hospital Quilts: The Hospital can display 9 large quilts, with sleeve. The sleeve should be sewn on, but safety pins no farther apart than 2" on both sides of the sleeve will be accepted.

You may drop your quilts off anytime at Sew n Sew. They will be stored on the racks in the back room of the store.

All quilts are due at Sew 'n Sew by Friday, May 10th, 2024 and will be delivered to the businesses by May 15. The quilts will be returned in early July.

Some Interesting Facts.....

- The average quilter is 63 years old.
- "Dedicated quilters" (those who spend more than \$500 per year on quilting) buy, on average, 99 yards of fabric a year, almost an entire football field's worth.
- Dedicated quilters usually spend an average of \$3,363 on quilting supplies per year.
- Beginning quilters spend an average of 6.9 hours a week on their craft. Advanced quilters spend around 17.6 hours.
